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Have your say about the TfL Cycle Route through the Park

The six week public consultation period has now started for Transport for London's (TfL) proposals for a cycle superhighway (CS11) through Regent's Park. If implemented, these proposals will affect many residents and businesses in and around the Park. They will have a major influence on the Park's environment in both positive and negative ways. In particular, TfL proposes changing the times at which some park gates will be open to vehicles in order to reduce the through-traffic using the Park.

The organisations and local authorities with responsibilities for Regent's Park want to hear your views and priorities as a Park resident about the key aspects of these proposals before considering implementing any final scheme. To help Park residents make their response to TfL about these proposals the CEPC will be holding drop-in information sessions at its Park Square East offices on the following dates:

For residents in terraces adjoining the Marylebone Road:

- 5.00pm to 7.30pm **Thursday 10th March 2016** at 12 Park Square East

The CEPC strongly encourages you to visit the TfL website, understand the details of the proposals and then to give your considered response directly to TfL. Representatives of particular interest groups and those from outside the park will also be responding, so it will be very important for as many park residents as possible to make their views known if a balanced appraisal of the proposals is to emerge from the consultation. The deadline for your responses by mail and email is Sunday 20th March.
